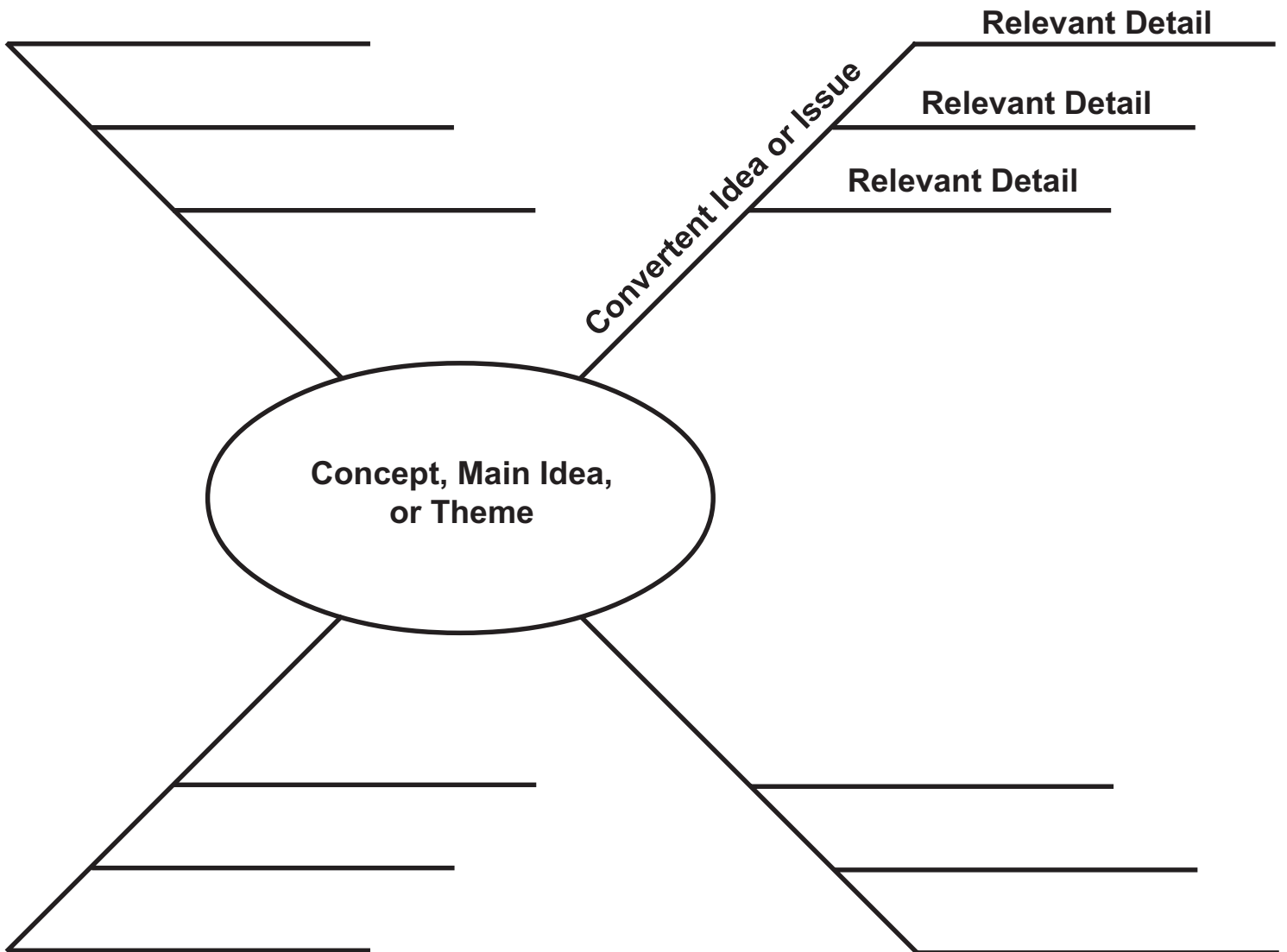

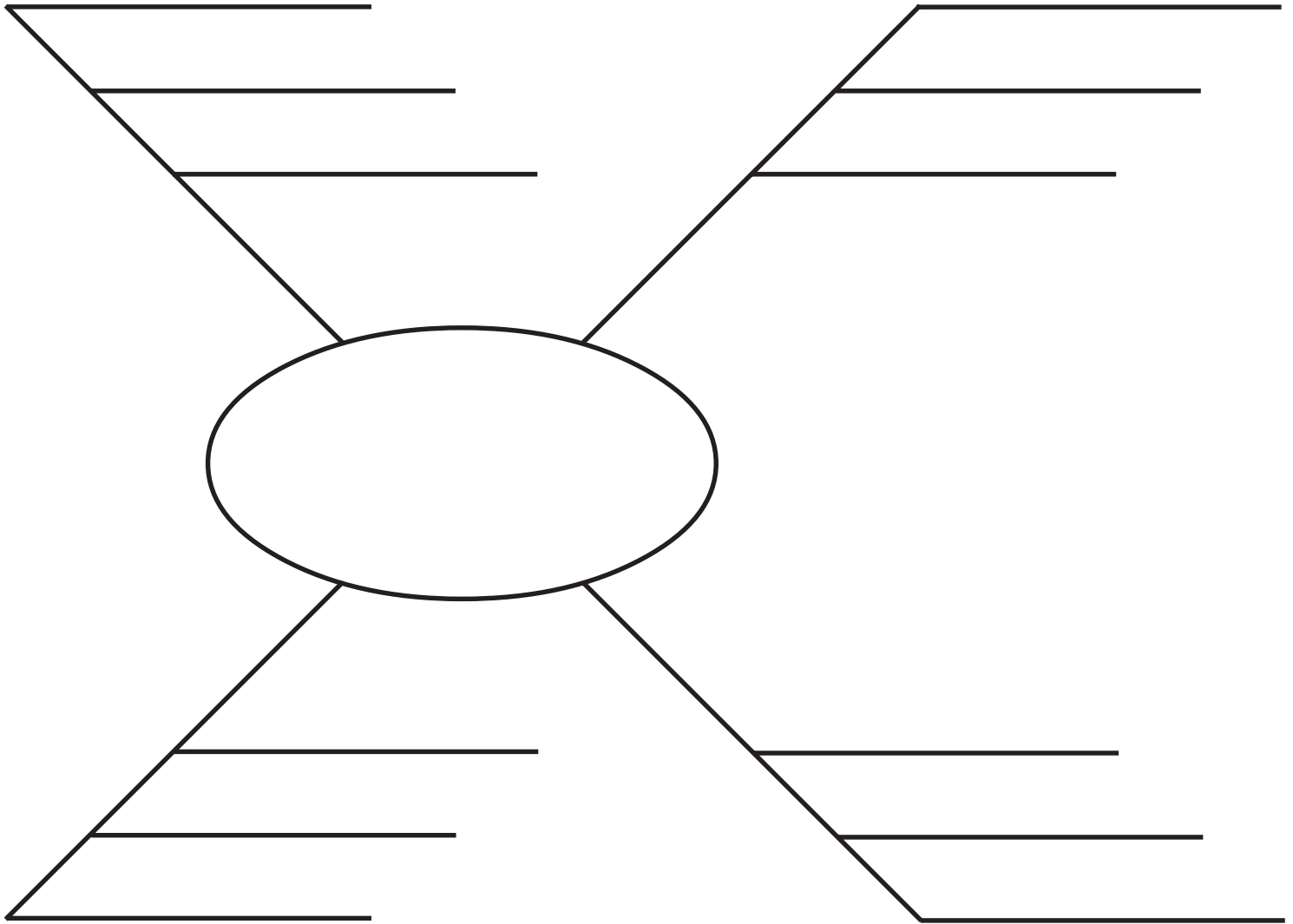
This organizer can be used for helping students understand how a central theme can have several convergent ideas or issues. And further, they can describe some of the details that are associated with each idea.

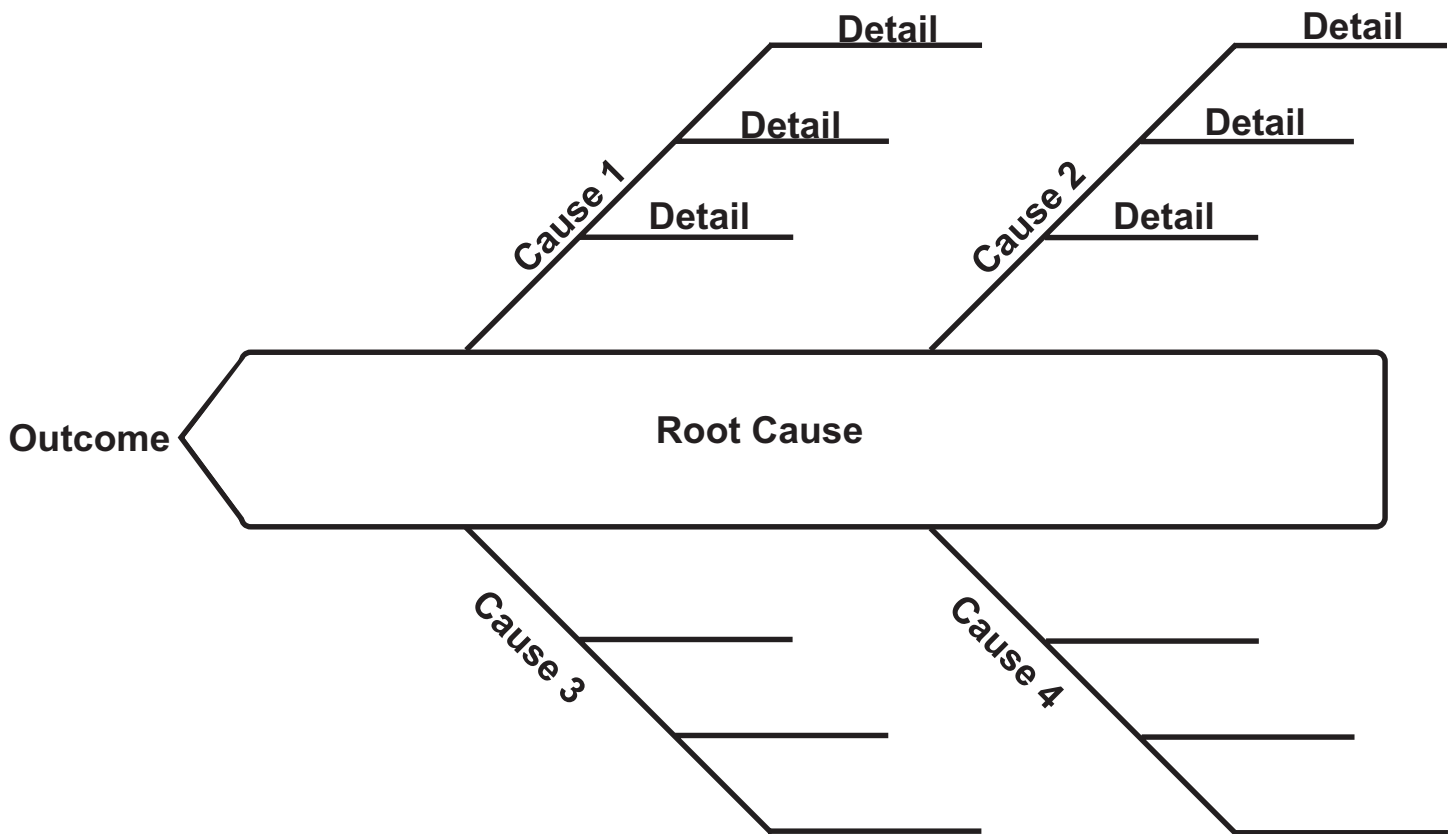

The Fishbone Graphic Organizer

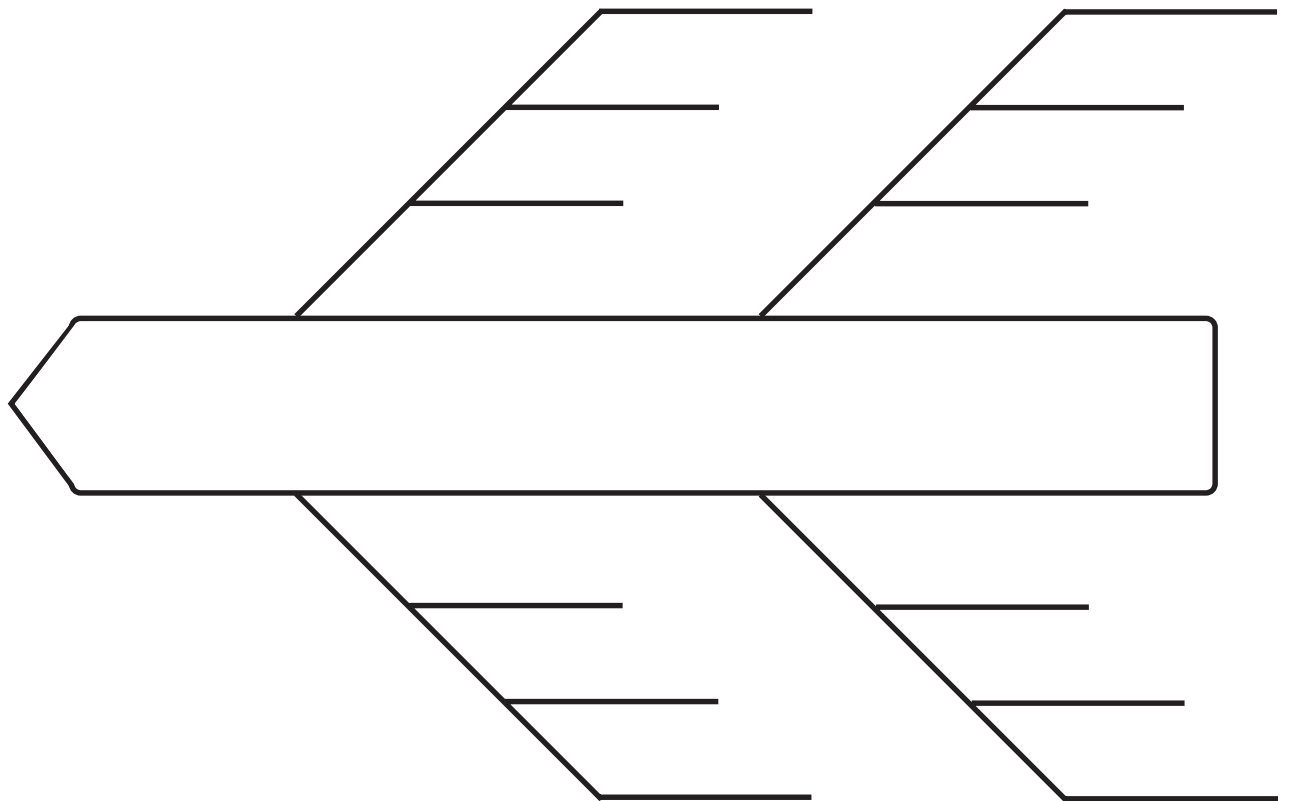
This organizer can be used for helping students understand how a result can have several convergent causes. And further, they can describe some of the details that are associated with each cause.

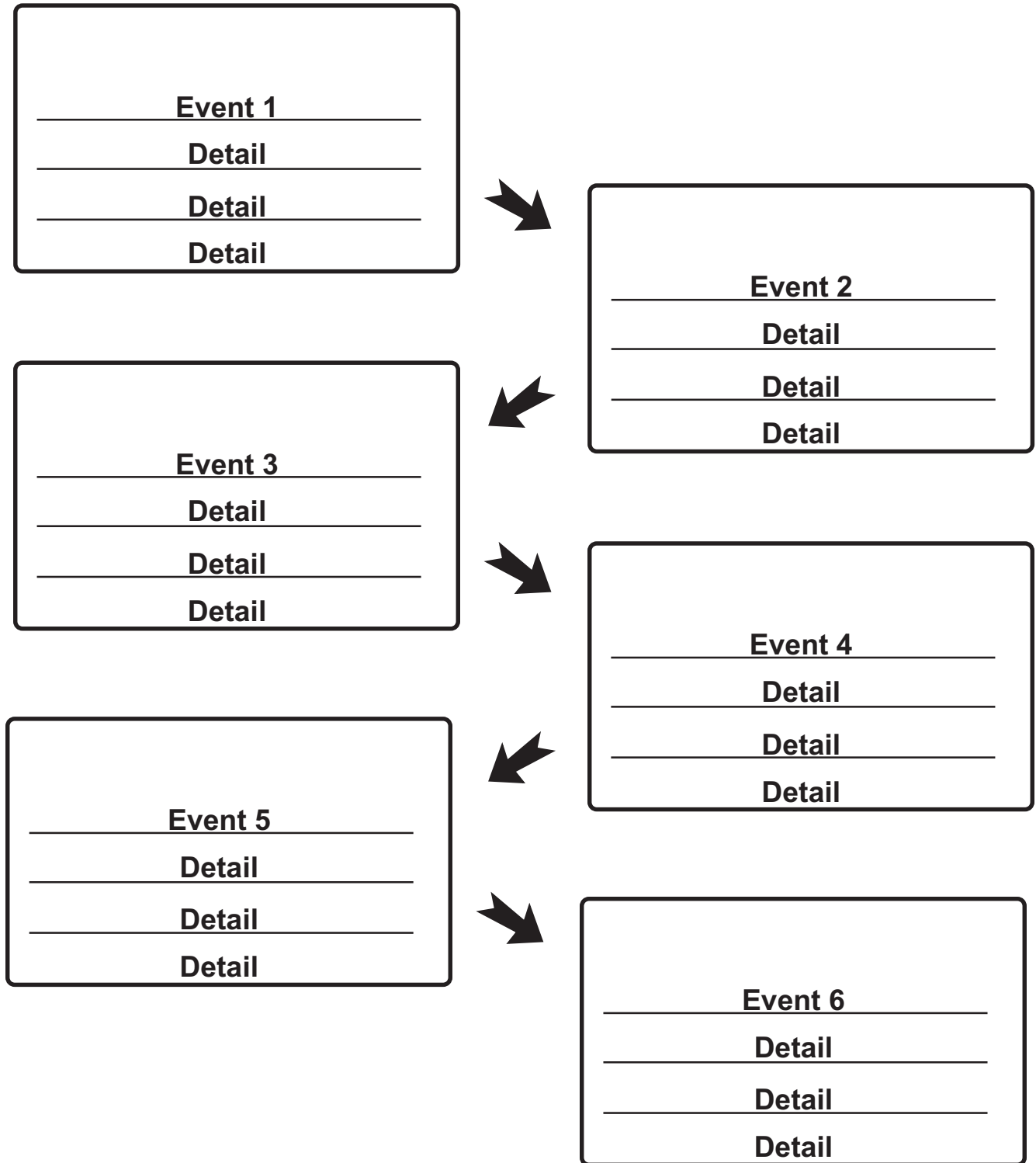

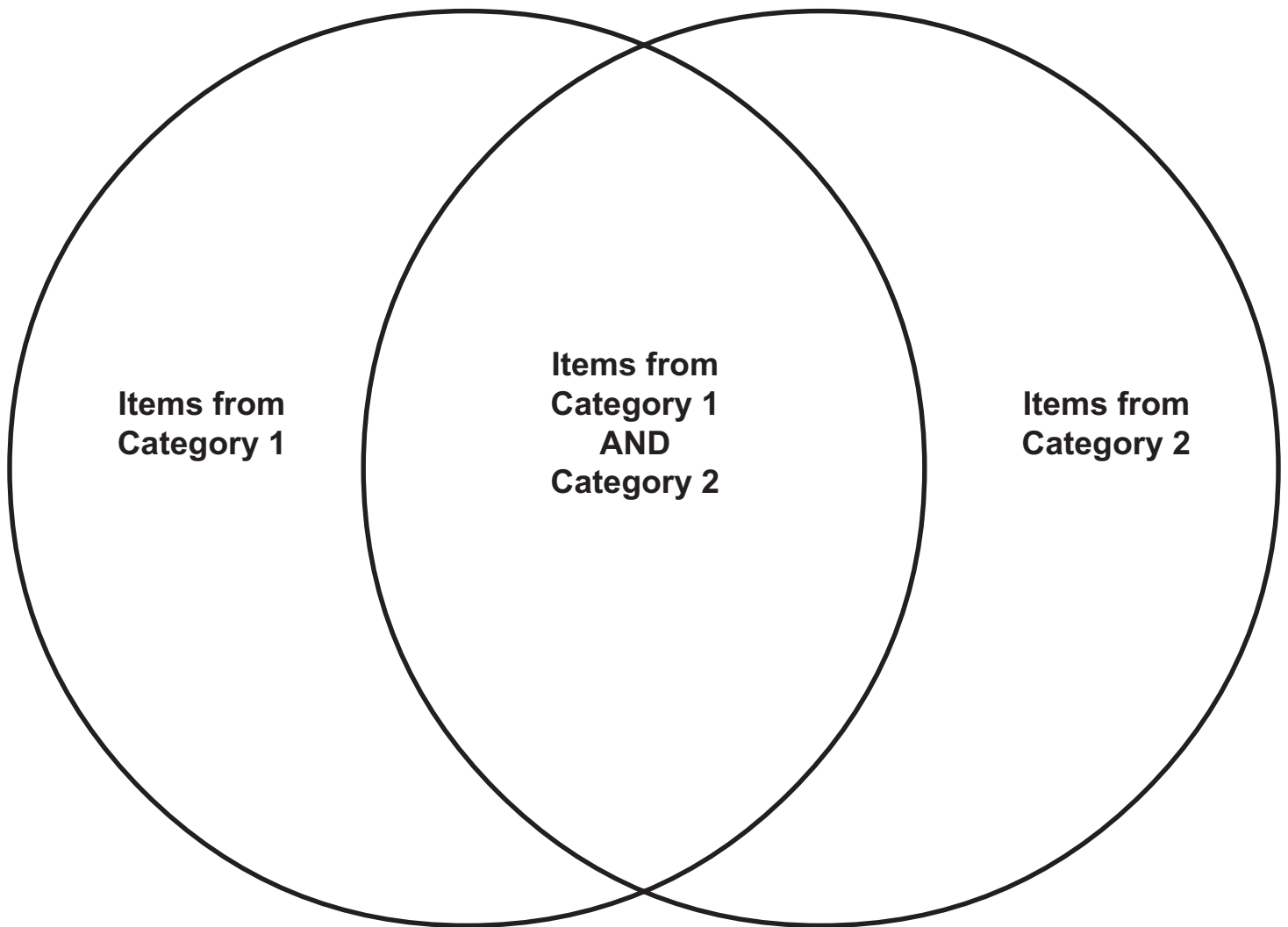






The Venn Diagram Graphic Organizer

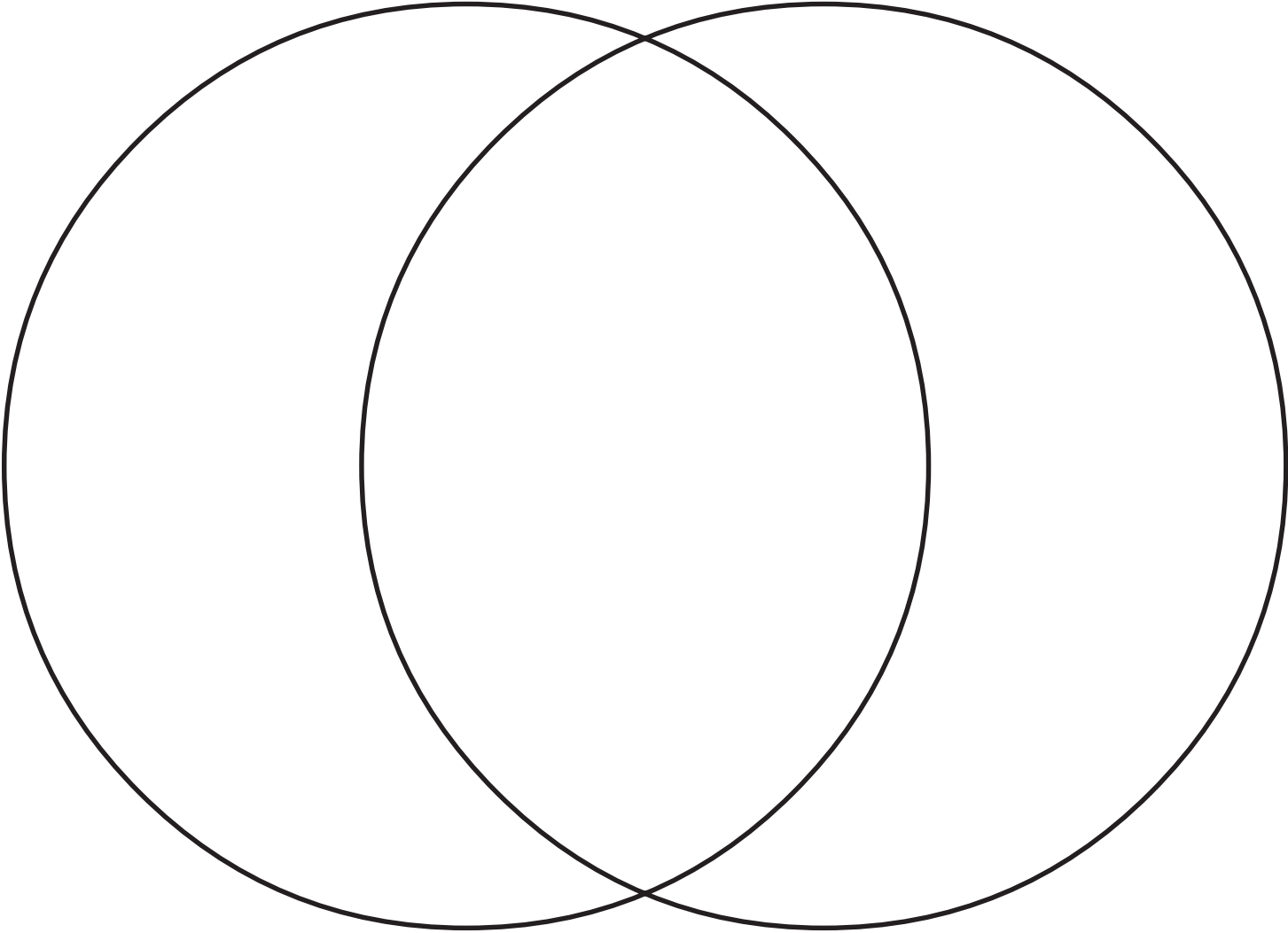
This organizer can be used for helping students understand how events, issues, concepts and particularly categories can be overlapping.

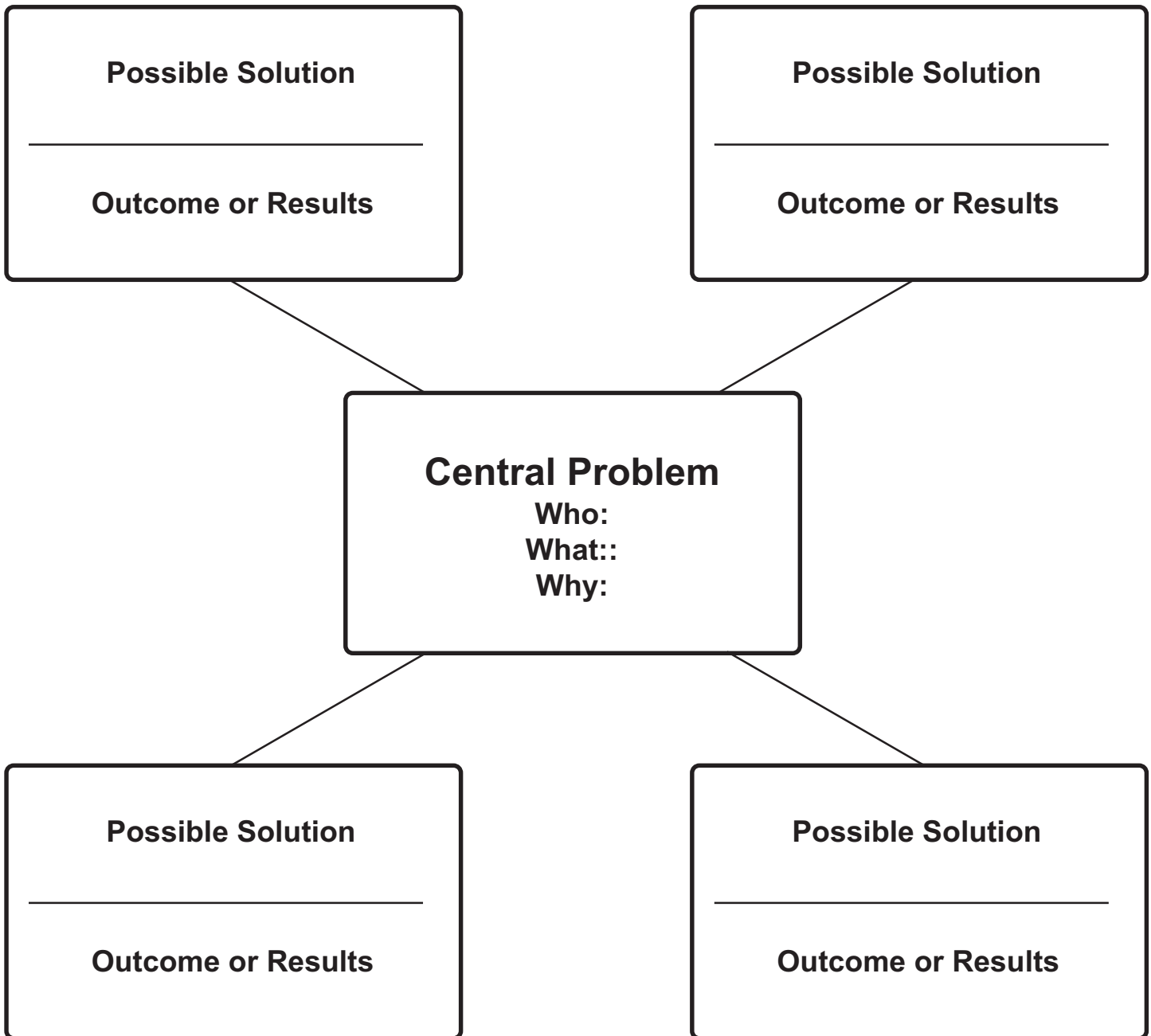

This organizer can be used for helping students understand how a single problem can have more than one possible solution. Students can brainstorm ideas for possible solutions, and consider what the different outcomes might be.

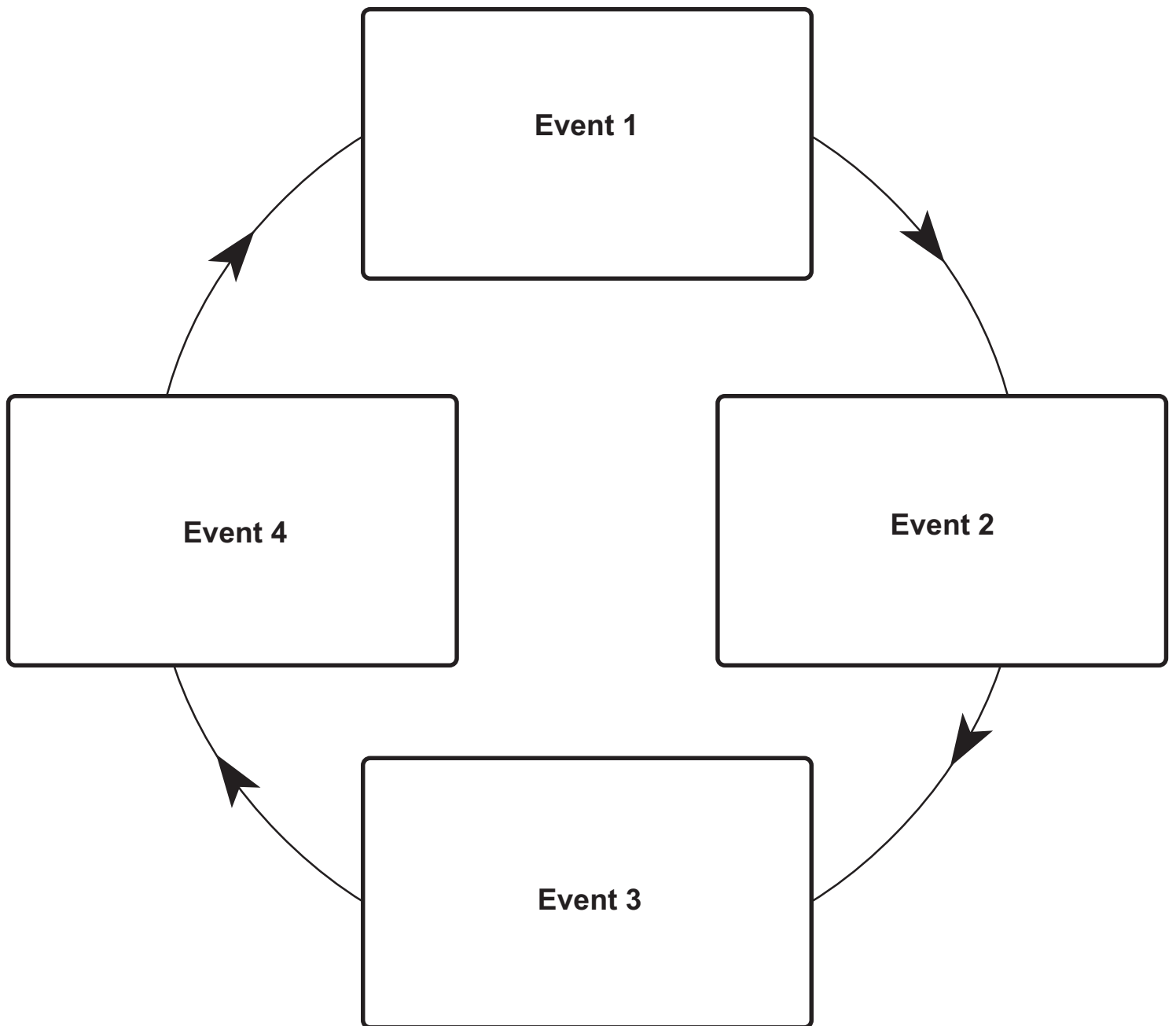

The Cycle Graphic Organizer

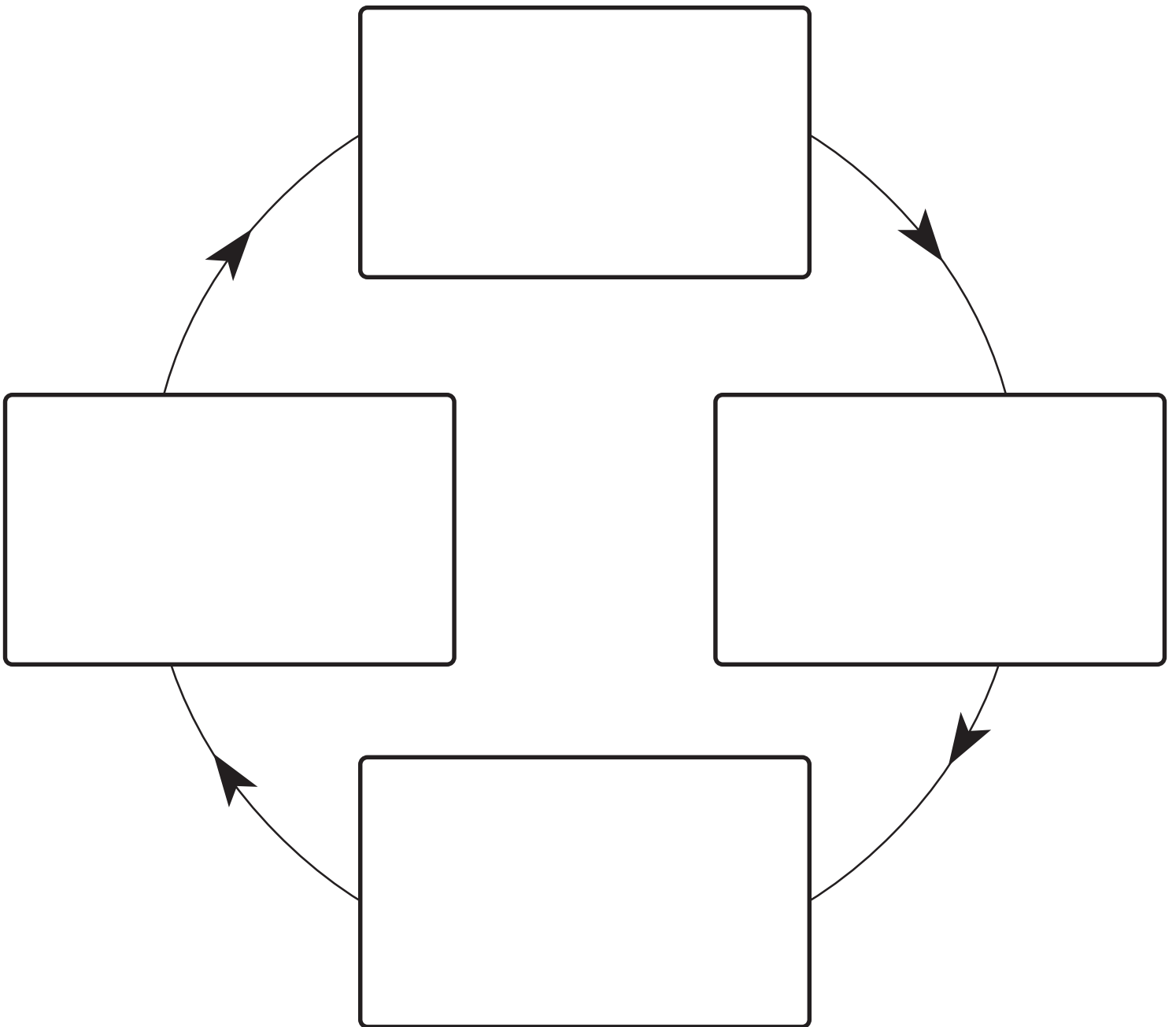
This organizer can be used for helping students understand how a events or issues can be circular or cyclic.

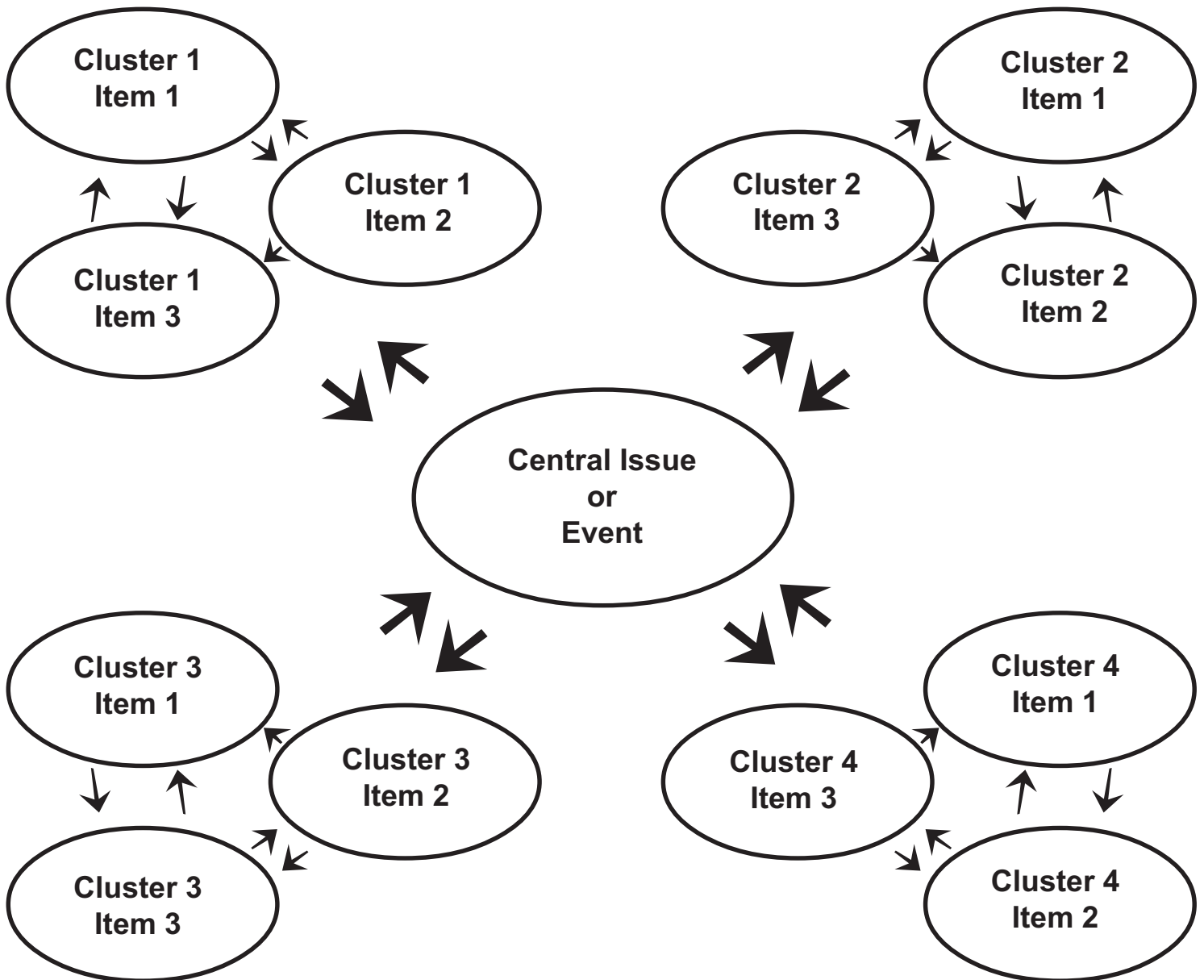

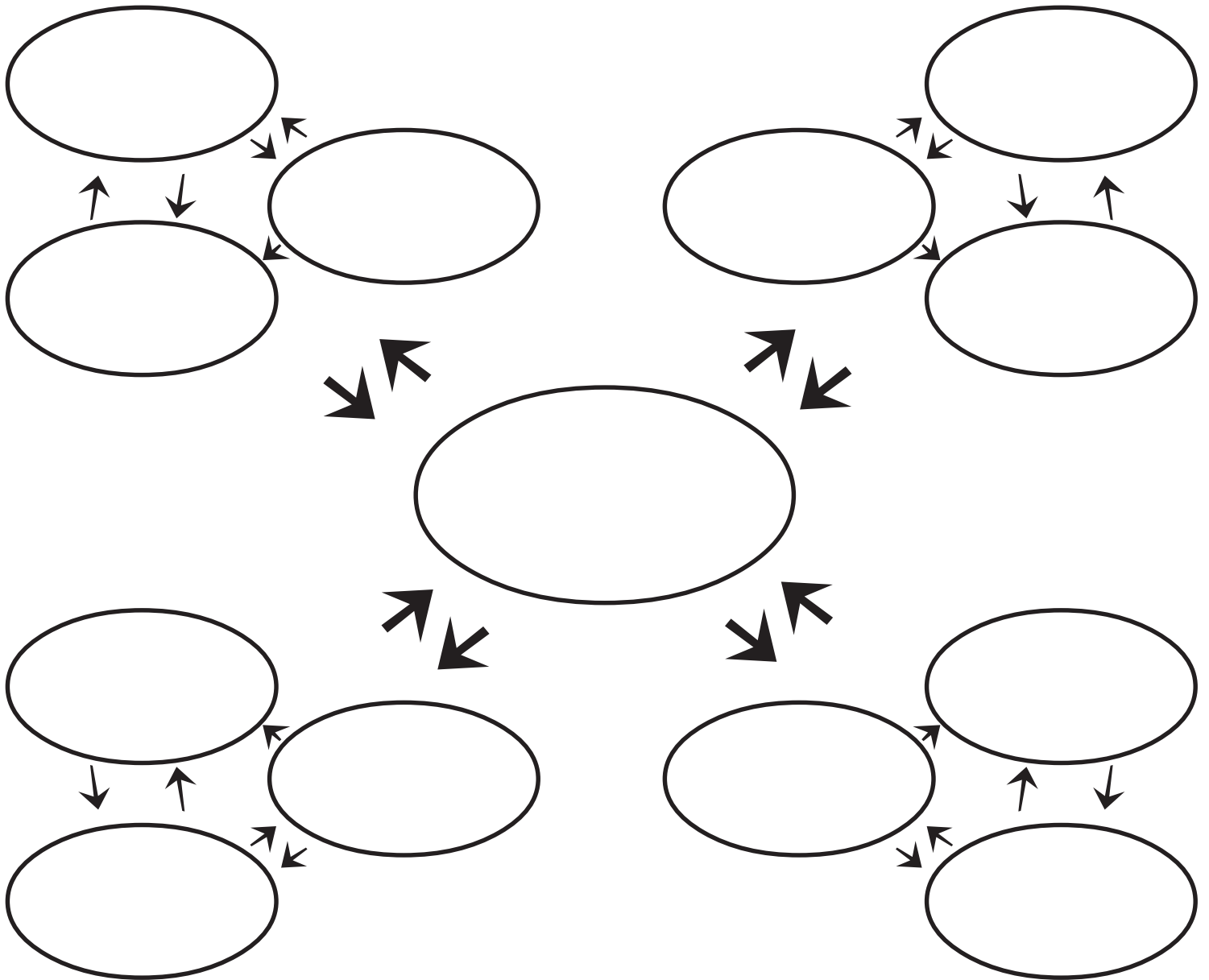
The Cluster Graphic Organizer

The KWL Graphic Organizer

This chart helps children (and teachers) to organize their learning into three categories: What do I already know about the subject, what would I like to know about the subject, and what have I learned about the subject.

Children fill out the first and second categories before a lesson begins (What do I know, and what would I like to learn?), and they fill out the third category after a lesson has been taught (What have I learned?).
